





HO & N FORD® FAIRMONT SEDANS

The Ford® Fairmont was a rear wheel drive compact car introduced in 1978 and sold through 1983 in North America.

As the first vehicle built off the Ford® Fox platform, the 1978 Ford® Fairmont replaced the Ford® Maverick. This platform would serve as the foundation for several other models such as the Thunderbird, the 1981-82 American Ford® Granada and the 1979-2004 Mustang.

Three body styles were introduced with the release of the Fairmont-coupe, sedan, and wagon. The 1978 Fairmont set the record for production of a new model, defeating the record that was previously held by the 1965 Mustang, making it quite the rousing success for Ford®. The Fairmont was an efficient combination of passenger room and cargo space for its size, garnering praise in the automotive media and drawing comparisons with competing Volvo and BMW models.

At its introduction, the Fairmont was equipped with two headlights, though this was later remedied in 1981 where the number was upped to four. A variety of engines were available, including a 2.3 L four-cylinder, 3.3 L (200 cu in) six, and 255 cu in and 302 cu in V8s. A turbo-charged four-cylinder version was planned for 1980 but never made it to production.

Coming in a range of prototypical colors, these vehicles will look right at home parked in front of our garage kits, out on the streets of your layout, or, for layouts based in late 1977 or 1978, as loads on open auto racks.

N PRODUCT HIGHLIGHTS



Expected for November 2007 delivery, this new run of one undecorated unit and eight new paint schemes come ready-to-run and feature accurate painting and printing including door hinges, ladders, grab irons and end straps, opening roof hatches, realistic handle and latch detail, wood grain finish detail on car body and 40-ton friction bearing trucks with AccuMate® couplers.



N U23B Locomotive

The new road names and paint schemes we've selected for the GE U23B epitomize the once pervasive popularity of this intermediate-sized four-axle road-switcher. From 1968 –1977, 481 units were produced, making this the second best seller of GE's "Universal Series" locomotives.

Powered by a 2250hp V12 FDL prime mover, the first units were delivered to Delaware & Hudson in 1968. CSX predecessors Chesapeake & Ohio* and Louisville & Nashville* had a combined fleet of 120 units, giving CSX one of the larger active fleets. Penn Central, Santa Fe and Missouri Pacific also purchased sizeable fleets of U23Bs. Today the number of active U23B's has dwindled, but some can still be found working for short lines and regional railroads in North America.

Primary spotting features include a stepped-out radiator section and two sets of three tall engine access doors near the center of the long hood. The U23B was equipped with various truck side frames, including Blomberg trucks from EMD trade-in locomotives, AAR-style trucks, or GE's own four-axle "FB2" truck. One of these three truck styles is included on our model as appropriate per road name.

We anticipate a September 2007 delivery for these locomotives, which feature operational low nose headlight where appropriate, separate coupler cut lever, cab with four or two side windows as appropriate, directional lighting, golden white LEDs, painted safety rails, blackened metal wheels and a dual flywheel equipped 5-pole skewed armature motor with a low friction mechanism. The four undecorated units and seven new road names of three road numbers each come in DCC ready and DCC equipped versions and have factory-installed AccuMate® magnetic knuckle couplers.

N 40' Wood Reefer

The rolling history lesson that is the legacy of wood reefer cars of the Steam Era can be yours with this run of colorful and exciting new paint schemes from Atlas! This highly detailed model is based on the 40' wood refrigerator cars built by Pullman for the Northern Refrigerator Car Co. in 1930. With its rooftop ice hatches, USRA-style fishbelly underframe and vertical brake shaft, it is representative of the thousands of similar cars built during the "billboard" era of American railroads from the 1920s to the 1940s.

These exact replicas are favorites among model railroaders young and old for their famous product names, creative artwork and advertising prevalence during their heyday. Add one, or more, to your layout and wait for the kudos!

N GP-38, GP-40 & GP-40-2 Locomotives

Now available in a kaleidoscope of new paint schemes and road numbers, these high quality locomotives are modeled after Electro Motive Division's 2000 horsepower GP-38 diesel introduced in the late 1960s and built through the early 1970s; still in service today throughout North America. The GP-38 is usually identified by its two radiator fans located on top of the long hood and two small exhaust stacks. The GP-40 was produced the Electro Motive Division in the late 1960s and early 1970s, the GP-40 was a 3000 horsepower locomotive best characterized by the three full size radiator fans on the rear of the roof. The GP-40-2 was the successor to the popular EMD GP-40. The GP-40-2 had mostly internal changes, but several outside details varied as well, including bolted down battery box covers and a roof that extends slightly beyond the rear of the cab.

Among the many desirable features we've packed into these stunningly accurate locomotives are directional lighting, walkway safety treads, blackened metal wheels, a Scale Speed™ motor, goldenwhite LEDs, and dynamic brakes where appropriate.
