Built in the 1960s by the Electro-Motive Division of General Motors, the GP-30 Locomotives were four-wheel truck road switchers that were used in heavy-haul freight services throughout the country. The 2,250 horse power GP-30 locomotive was EMD's first step into what was referred to as the "Second Generation" of locomotives. 948 GP-30s were produced for North American railroads between July 1961 and November 1963. This locomotive was EMD's answer to GE's U25B locomotive. The GP-30's distinctive high profile, stepped cab could be found on railroads coast to coast.

General Electric's "Dash 7" locomotive line was introduced as a replacement for the older "Universal-Series" of the 60s and early 70s. "Dash 7" series improvements included increased fuel efficiency, tractive effort and reliability. The B23-7 was a direct replacement for the 2,250HP U23B model. The first units were produced for Conrail in September, 1977 (ironically, 3 months after the last U23B was delivered to Conrail). Production continued through 1984, with a total of 535 units built. Conrail was the largest purchaser of the model, with a total fleet of 141 units.

The prototype for the 17,600 Gallon Corn Syrup Tank Car was built in large numbers by Trinity Industries between 1984 and 1998. Of the over 7,000 cars that were built, most are still in active service today.

These tank cars are commonly used to transport varying grades of Corn Syrup, Liquid Sugar, and Molasses from processing facilities to bulk distribution centers and other end-users throughout the US and Canada. They are a very common sight on today's railroads, and they have been for two decades. This initial release features three of the most common manway/top platform arrangements as specified by ADM, Cargill, and Corn Products (among others).



Covered hoppers are a relatively new car family. The AAR considered these "special" cars until the 1980s when they finally got their own car type code category. These early covered hopper designs were built primarily for more efficient cement loading and unloading (previously cement was bagged and placed in box cars). This two-bay covered hopper car design was built by Pullman-Standard starting in the late 1940s with production continuing into the 1950s. This car features eight round roof hatches for quick loading. Two large gravity gates were used to discharge the commodity as quickly as possible. Capacity is rated at 2,003 cubic foot.



The Association of American Railroads (AAR) developed a standard design for 50-ton and 70-ton twin offset open hopper cars starting in the late 1920s. The design was modified in the mid-1930s, and through 1960 over 127,000 cars had been built to the basic AAR specification. Nearly all major car builders of the time constructed cars of this 33' interior length design, and some were even built at railroad home shops. Eastern coal carriers such as Chesapeake & Ohio, Baltimore & Ohio and Louisville & Nashville each amassed the largest fleets. However, the twin offset hopper design was not limited to coal service, with ore and aggregates also being hauled. They could also be found operating in a wide range of services including unit coal trains, blocks of loaded cars destined to a large consignee, and even "loose" single car loads heading to smaller customers.



At the end of World War II, railroads ordered large numbers of 50' AAR boxcars with a standard design that was first widely used in the late 1940s. This design was based on the original 1937 AAR design but was modified in the post-war era to include: improved dreadnaught end and diagonal panel roofs with standard or overhanging design. These 50' box cars were a common sight on American railroads well into the 1970s and 1980s.





This new 52' 6" interior length design was in response to the newly allowed increase in Gross Rail Loading (GRL) to 286,000 lbs (up from 263,000 lbs). 




