Can I begin by giving a most sincere and heartfelt "Thank You" to all of our customers throughout the World who have supported us over the past twelve months. It has been, and probably will continue to be, a period of global uncertainty; but despite the fact, the past twelve months have been the busiest in the history of Dapol. There have been many occasions where, despite working as quickly as we can, we still could not satisfy market demands; indeed, at a time of UK job losses, Dapol have actually increased our work force in an attempt to match product availability with customer needs.

At this point I need to put in writing my thanks to the most important part of Dapol - our employees. Over the past year they have worked tirelessly, under great pressure and with ever-changing demands on their skills; not once have they complained and their continual ability to produce top-quality products exactly when it is needed, has my undying admiration.

One of the biggest obstacles we encountered during 2008-09 was the continual delays in obtaining electronic subcontract parts from Asia and which seriously affected our planned release schedules. You may recall that I identified this precise issue in our 2009 catalogue - I had hoped the Asian economy would have improved over the period, but it has just not happened. Therefore we now have to forward-plan between nine and twelve months on key subcontract parts and then keep our fingers crossed that the plans work! This means that we cannot be as precise on delivery dates as we would like for any motorised product and will therefore continue to use our website as a method of providing accurate information as soon as it becomes available. I do appreciate that some customers may find this frustrating - but please believe me when I say that its more frustrating for Dapol.

So, looking onward over the next twelve months at Dapol well, to be honest it is all 100% positive. This catalogue is bursting with new products, both 'N' and 'OO' and too many to explain here in words. Dur Dapol Track Cleaner has been an unbelievable success story; since its launch late last year we have produced over 12,000 units. This is obviously 'new territory' for us, but we actually think that it could be classed as 'Possibly the biggest selling model in the World'.

Britannia Pacific





Introduced to haul express passenger trains, the Britannia standard 7 class of locomotives were introduced in 1951. Fifty five were produced to the 4-6-2 wheel arrangement.

They were all named and could be seen over most of Great Britain at one time or another. The 'flagship' of the class was arguably '70000 Britannia' which is one of the eight models we are producing during the next year.

With both 'Britannia' and 'Oliver Cromwell' seeing service on the main line since the end of steam, these models will make a perfect addition to the modern modeller that wants to run 'something different', as well as the steam-era modeller that wants one or more of these glorious models on their layout.

This engine has been around since the early days of electrification on the West Coast main line and members of the class graduated away to the Eastern region for Liverpool Street to Norwich express passenger trains.

Others have been seen on freight (mixed, container and mail) while two have been re-employed on overhead line ice removal. Some are now re-entering service with private rail companies.










Catenary



Our new Catenary system begins with the introduction of the ubiquitous line-side single mast.

Made from high impact plastic, this mast will feature a moulded 1 piece mast, arm (two lengths for accurate depiction) & concrete base, with a threaded bolt on the bottom and plastic wing nut.

Simply drill or make a hole in your baseboard to the correct diameter of the bolt, insert the mast bolt into the hole and tighten up the 'wing-nut'

If you break the mast accidentally simply unscrew and fit a new one.

They will come in packs of 10 and will be in the shops alongside the release of the Class 86 locomotive.





The Great Western Railway's maid of all work, the 43XX class 'Mogul' 2-6-0 steam locomotive.

324 locomotives of the class were built in several batches and variants between 1911 and 1932. The Mogul was essentially a tender version of the GWR's successful 3150 prairie tank and no prototype was considered necessary. It was the first GWR class to be built with a top-feed from new. The locomotives had wide route availability and could be seen over the whole of the GWR network apart from the lightest routes. The last three Moguls were withdrawn in November 1964 and only two examples have been preserved. The Ixion model will represent the 63XX version with Churchward style cabsides and will be produced in a variety of GWR and British Railways liveries. Available in 2010.
