

These workhorses of steam really show why Graham Farish is the undisputed leader in the world of 'N' Gauge.





#### Diesel and Electric Locomotives

The Graham Farish range of Diesel locomotives was impressive before the introduction of the Class 31's. Now, like the diesels themselves, it's simply awesome.

Once again the philosophy of Graham Farish is apparent. The authentic modelling captures every detail of this tough little diesel while the set of three models embraces the history of the Class 31. From its first appearance in 1957 with the unmistakable head code box, through to the yellow panel version with marker lights and onto the Regional railways livery.

It's a 30 year jump to the Class 90 Electric locomotives built by BR between 1987 and 1990, but in 'N' Gauge everything comes to those who wait.

The Graham Farish range of Class 90's are so realistic, they could have been painted at the Crewe Works. Couple up BBC Northwest to a rake of Intercity Executive Bogie Coaches (also in the Graham Farish catalogue) and just marvel at the authenticity.
